Headwaters Arts requires submitted art images to be named as follows:

Each Jpeg file must include the artist's name, underscore, title, underscore, medium, underscore and size (height by width by depth) in inches.

For example: JohnSmith_TheShadowsofSummer_Acrylic_36x30x1.5.jpg

Steps to rename an image file on an iPhone:

- 1. Open the Photos app on your iPhone.
- 2. Navigate to the photo you want to rename.
- 3. Tap on the photo to open it.
- 4. Tap the "Share" button in the bottom left corner of the screen.
- 5. Scroll down and tap "Save to Files."
- 6. Select a location to save the file (e.g., iCloud Drive or create an "ART" folder!).
- 7. Tap "Add" to save the file.
- 8. Open the Files app and navigate to the location where you saved the file.
- 9. Tap and hold on the file until a menu appears.
- 10. Tap "Rename" and type in the new name for the file.
- 11. Tap "Done" to save the new name.

Steps to rename an image file on an Android phone:

- 1. Open the "Files" app on your Android phone.
- 2. Navigate to the folder that contains the image file you want to rename.
- 3. Tap and hold on the image file until a checkmark appears next to it.
- 4. Tap on the three-dot icon in the top right corner of the screen.
- 5. Select "Rename" from the menu.
- 6. Type in the new name for the image file in the text field.
- 7. Tap "OK" or "Save" to save the new name.

Alternatively, you can also rename an image file from the Gallery app on your Android phone:

- 1. Open the "Gallery" app on your Android phone.
- 2. Navigate to the image file you want to rename.
- 3. Tap on the image to open it.
- 4. Tap on the three-dot icon in the top right corner of the screen.
- 5. Select "Details" from the menu.
- 6. Tap on the pencil icon next to the current file name.
- 7. Type in the new name for the image file in the text field.
- 8. Tap "Save" to save the new name.
